Mary Junkin Buchanan Cowley (1853 - 1937)

- In 1912, she became a member of the First Court-Appointed Pittsburgh Board of Education
- President of the Playground & Vacation School Association of Allegheny for 34-years.
- Dedicated her life to the establishment of 40 playgrounds in underprivileged districts in the City.



During WWI, he was Chairman of Draft Board No. 20, and while serving in this capacity "attracted almost nationwide attention when he firmly refused to allow a trainload of draftees to move out because there was not sufficient seating accommodation for each man, and no drinking water..." Pittsburgh City Council honored Mr. Goettmann by changing the name of the street in which he lives from Return Street to Goettmann Street.

Carl F. Goettmann

• From a young age, he worked for the Joseph Horne Co., eventually becoming the Director of Store Decorations, creating window displays that were "notable for their rich simplicity."



"Psychology has taught in great measure the essentials in the four stages through which the successful window display must function: it must attract, interest, convince and influence to action... the appeal must not only be to the intellect, but also to the emotions. In this respect the display man never forgets that the display must be essentially correct and at all times noble and worthy of respect."

Cowley-Goettman Recreation Center (1939 - 2003)

- Built in 1939, renovated in 1977 and in 1987. The facility closed in 2003.
- Windows & MEP Systems are all original to the building.
- The facility is severely deteriorated and in a significant state of disrepair. Flooring has been ruined due to water infiltration and painted surfaces have peeled.
- There are significant hazardous materials present (mold, lead paint, asbestos).
