

## **Proposed Robinson Street Mobility and Infrastructure Improvements**

In response to community feedback voicing longstanding concerns with Robinson Street's heavy traffic, speeding, and more, the Oakland Plan has developed proposals to make Robinson Street safer for all, more comfortable for pedestrians and cyclists, and designed to better reduce flooding risks during rainstorms.


These proposals would seek to introduce new elements along Robinson Street, possibly including the following:

- A redesigned intersection at Robinson and Fifth that provides safer pedestrian and cyclist access near the future Bus Rapid Transit station
- A median at Robinson and Fifth preventing illegal turns onto the Boulevard of the Allies onramp, which could help reduce the number of cars cutting through the neighborhood to reach I-376
- Safer intersections at Robinson and Terrace and Robinson and Allequippa designed to slow traffic
- Raised mid-block crosswalks near Ellers Street and near Dunbar Way designed to slow traffic
- Curb bump-outs into the street at select spots, providing space to plant trees and landscaping to absorb stormwater, while slowing traffic
- Shared lane markings showing that cars and bicycles share the street
- A mobility hub for bikes and/or scooters at Allequippa
