


Sheraden Park Walls and Drives, 1934



KEY TAKEAWAYS

- Most of the original park trails and paths are still prominent today.
- A swimming pool and building was originally located near the main park entrance.
- Several features included in this design were never realized, such as step entry from Sherwood Street.


Park Building Drawing Set, 1939



KEY TAKEAWAYS

- The original building was designed as a living quarters for a park caretaker.
- The building was constructed in 1939.
- The original design included a portico and deck, which has since been covered with an addition.
- The concrete steps and sidewalk surrounding the building are original.
- Estimated original construction cost: \$2,000.

KEY TAKEAWAYS

- The area along trail/ Surban Street was
- originally designed as a picnic area.
- Flowering trees were incorporated into the original landscape design.
- Stone walls from original design are still present on-site.











