
How a Playground is Designed

- Replacement vs. Redevelopment
 - Replacement
 - Footprint remains the same
 - Equipment is replaced in-kind
 - Generally shorter design/build times, less capital funding
 - Redevelopment
 - Expands/extends footprint beyond what already exists
 - More complex, typically longer timeline, more capital dollars



Considerations for Upper McKinley

- Playground is out of compliance with:
 - Current code
 - Guidelines
 - Standards for playground safety
- Equipment needs to be replaced ASAP for safety
- Small park in need of accessible equipment





New and Improved Design

- All items being added/replaced are to meet inclusivity standards
- Design elements specially for individuals with mobility needs in mind
- Removal of 2-bay swing set for nest swing and unity spinner
 - Accommodates more kids at once





New and Improved Design: Nest Swing

- Meant to accommodate multiple children
 - All ages, sizes, and physical abilities
 - Encourages group play
- 1 nest swing can hold up to 6 kids







New and Improved Design: Unity Spinner

- Slow-moving, ADA-accessible piece of equipment
 - Includes children of all ages and abilities
 - Designated space for disabled individuals, with straps to safely secure
- **Not** a fast-moving or dangerous apparatus
 - Not like the merry-go-rounds of the 90's
- Can easily accommodate 10+ kids







Community decision

- Option #1: No installation in the spring
 - Design and install will take at least two years since it is not in the 2023 budget
 - New park would likely look similar to proposed design
- Option #2: Install in spring
 - The park, as shown in the previous images, is paid for and ready to go
