2023 Budget Priorities

- Investment in core services and operations
- Bridge asset management
- Parks maintenance and land care
- Snow removal
- ADA work moves to Mayor's Office
- Affordable housing



Traffic Calming 101

- Approximately **1,000** requests per year; funding for 1-2 per council district per year
- Launching new request portal showing eligibility and status of applications. Submit 311 for now.
- If street is eligible, collect traffic data and score street using five (5) engineering criteria
- Selected projects for design and construction based on highest need, including equity

Stanton Avenue Complete Street Phase 1







Stanton Avenue Phase 2 Calming Needs Assessment

- Documented Calming Needs:
 - West of Highland Ave: 68% speeding
 - East of Highland Ave: 33% speeding
- Concerning 5-year History of Crashes:
 - 62 crashes with 28 injuries, 1 fatality





Stanton Avenue Complete Streets Phase 2 Implementation

•Scope: Stanton Ave from Chislett to Meadow/Heberton

• Pedestrian, Transit & Bicycle Safety Needs

• Busy Transit Stops for PRT Routes 75 & 87

• Identified as route on Bike+ Plan

Pedestrian Tunnel Project








Reservoir Drive: Paving and Calming



- Improvements focused on pedestrian & cyclist safety & comfort
- •Design informed by stakeholder collaboration in 2021-22
- •Construction schedule will be coordinated with pedestrian tunnel.

PWSA Projects Overview

Active Projects	Description
Highland Park Pump Station and Rising Main Project	 Replace large transmission mains going from the covered Highland Reservoir and out into system. Demolish and replace pump station near Mellon Terrace
Rising Mains 3&4 Rehabilitation and Replacement	 Ensure resiliency of two large transmission mains leading to Highland Park reservoirs.
Neighborhood Lead Line Replacement Project (East Liberty/Highland Park)	 ✓ Made possible by American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. ✓ Replace all lead lines within a geographic space.
Water Main Replacements	 ✓ Replace aging water mains ✓ Replace lead lines found attached to old main.
Sewer Rehabilitation	 Extending the life of sewers using lining technology, minimal excavations
Outstanding Street/Sidewalk Restorations	✓ ~20 sites
Completed Projects	Description
Highland Reservoir II Cover and Liner Project	 Replace liner and cover, complete other mechanical upgrades to reservoir.
