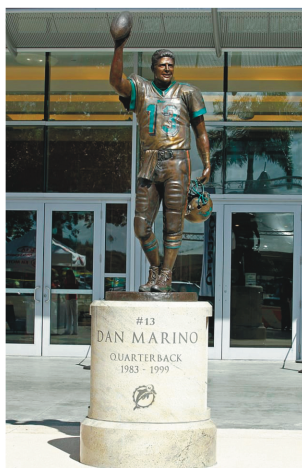

Please give a summary description of the project.	<p>Beginning in 2015, Homewood Community Sports, with the help of Heinz Endowments, Operation Better Block, Neighborhood Allies, Bridging the Gap Development, and The Mission Continues began a study of field improvements at Willie Stargell Field. The extensive community engagement process led to the development of a Master Plan for the existing Stargell Field and expansion of Homewood Park onto the previous Homewood School property along Hamilton Avenue. Based on the results of the Master Plan, the City of Pittsburgh's Department of Public Works and landscape architecture firm Studio Zewde are implementing a large-scale renovation of the park.</p> <p>In line with City Code requirements, 1% of the construction budget was allocated to public art, distributed between four artists.</p> <p>Artist Camerin Nesbit's proposal is for a life-sized sculpture of a bulldog to be placed along the route that the teams take to travel to the field. He wishes to create a community symbol that the participants of the sports programs can physically interact with, creating a space for gameday rituals.</p>
Who is this project intending to be used or experienced by?	The Homewood community, particularly the participants of the sports program.
What users/stakeholders/community members have been involved so far?	<p>Community representatives (Mubarik Ismaeli of Homewood Community Sports and Derrick Tillman of Bridging the Gap Development) who have long been involved in the park renovation plans were involved in the artist selection, as was public artist and then-current member of the Art Commission Janel Young.</p> <p>The artist is a resident of the neighborhood and has engaged with the community and members of the football community regarding his proposed design.</p>

What is the timeline of implementation?	Park renovation will begin early in 2024 and continue throughout the summer. Footers for this artwork will be installed when concrete is poured and the sculpture will be fully installed following completion of construction.
Are there plans for future expansion of this project?	N/a.
What is the budget for this project, and what are the funding sources?	The budget for this project is \$45,000, and is paid for through the City's Percent For Art program.
Who will be responsible for maintenance of this project, and are there dedicated sources of funding for maintenance?	This project will be owned by the City, and will be maintained as allowed through available funds allocated to the Public History, Art, and Design Division in the City's annual budget.

What will be done for the installation? For this installation, CAMO will be making a 3D statue/monument for the kids to value as a trophy or home feild advantage staple.

What imagery will be in this statue? The statue will be of a full sized bulldog, the bulldog will have a gold chain that says "Dawgs" along with an undersized football helmet on the dogs head. The pedestal will list of legendary Bulldawgs, coaches, and moments.



What will this statue be made of?

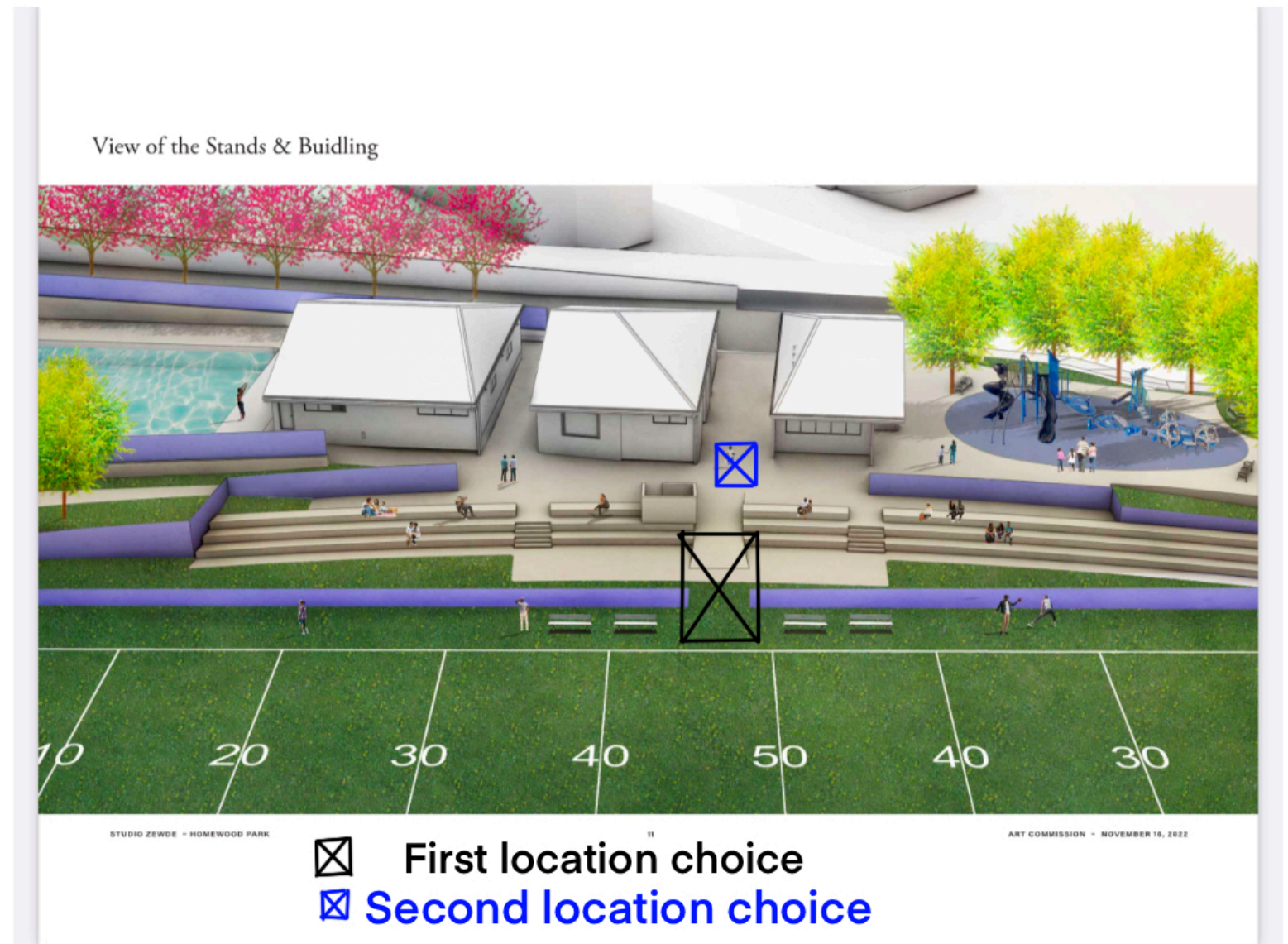
This particular statue will be made with a 3D printer, then molded into completion. Materials used will be the following: glass fiber-reinforced plastic (as shown in example) I do wish to make the whole statue of this material. Colors may very but I was thinking blue/gold.

Where will this statue be placed?

The statue will be placed somewhere in the section I highlighted. I will need a footer to be able to plant the statue in the concrete or on the feild



What are the demensions of the statue? The bulldog will be the size of an actual bulldog. I believe it will be no larger than 3ft tall, 2 feet wide, and 3ft long. The pedestal will be 3ft tall, 4-5ft wide 4-5ft tall. I do not wish to exceed those limits.

The statue should be drilled into a footer to hold its place in the ground or concrete.
