## Syl-o-gism

An instance of a form of reasoning in which a conclusion is drawn from two given or assumed propositions

Syl-o-gism is text based work integrated into the chainlink fencing surrounding homewood park. Inspired by the composition of the same name by Homewood's own, Mary Lou Williams, and a photograph from the Teenie Harris Archive, this work is both an aesthetic contribution to the park and part way-finding to the shrine that is the field. Using the device of a syllogism as a prompt, I have written the following poem: "There is joy on the field. The Shrine holds joy. Therefore The shrine is on the field." The poem takes cues from signage found in a Teenie Harris photo in the archives. My aim is to present the text in a directional gestural typography reminiscent of my mark making accompanied by marks collected from long exposure photographs of players on the field.
